



Substance Use Screening Policy

Rock Point School is committed to being a community free of alcohol and drug use, including the improper use of prescription drugs and any other substances. Students will be tested for substance use in the event that a staff member suspects that a student has been using drugs or alcohol, or if a student has an admissions contract that includes random drug testing. In the event that staff find it necessary to test a student not on a random screening list, the administration will contact the parents or guardian as soon as possible, but will not delay testing if delay may compromise the screening.

If a student is taking an approved medication, prescription, or nonprescription, and the medication is known to interfere with attaining accurate test results, the family must communicate that information to the school as soon as possible.

If a student refuses a test, it will be considered a failed test.

If a student hands in a “cold sample,” it will be considered a failed test.

If a student tampers with a test, it will be considered a failed test. Tampering with a test includes diluting a sample or taking any medication or substances that actually or allegedly (if a student is taking it under the assumption that it will interfere with accurate test results) alter the accuracy of the results of a screen.

If a current student uses substances during vacations or during any other time away from the school, it will be treated as the same failed test.
